1. INTRODUCTION

The purpose of this circular is to provide you with the notice of AGM and information regarding the resolutions to be proposed at the AGM relating to, among other things, (i) the granting of the Issue Mandate to the Directors; (ii) the granting of the Repurchase Mandate to the Directors; (iii) the granting of the Extension Mandate to the Directors; and (iv) the retirement and re-election of Directors.

LETTER FROM THE BOARD

2. ISSUE MANDATE, REPURCHASE MANDATE AND EXTENSION MANDATE

By ordinary resolutions passed at the annual general meeting of the Company held on 26 January 2017, the Directors were granted a general mandate to repurchase Shares and a general mandate to allot, issue and deal with Shares. These mandates will expire at the conclusion of the forthcoming AGM. At the AGM, the following resolutions (among other matters) will be proposed:

- (a) to grant the Issue Mandate to the Directors, i.e. to exercise all the powers of the Company to allot, issue and otherwise deal with additional Shares up to a maximum of 20% of the aggregate nominal amount of the share capital of the Company in issue on the date of passing of such resolution;
- (b) to grant the Repurchase Mandate to the Directors, i.e. to exercise all the power of the Company to repurchase Shares up to a maximum of 10% of the aggregate nominal amount of the share capital of the Company in issue on the date of passing of such resolution; and
- (c) to grant the Extension Mandate, i.e. to increase the number of Shares to be issued and allotted under the Issue Mandate by an additional number representing such number of Shares repurchased under the Repurchase Mandate.

As at the Latest Practicable Date, the total issued share capital of the Company included 500,000,000 Shares. Subject to the passing of the proposed resolution for the grant of the Issue Mandate and on the basis that no Shares are allotted and issued or repurchased by the Company prior to the AGM, the maximum number of new Shares to be issued under the Issue Mandate (if approved by the Shareholders at the AGM) is 100,000,000 Shares.

Each of the Issue Mandate and the Repurchase Mandate, if approved, will continue in force until the earliest of: (a) the conclusion of the next annual general meeting of the Company following the AGM; or (b) the end of the period within which the Company is required by the Companies Law or the Articles of Association to hold its next annual general meeting; or (c) the revocation or variation of the authority given under such resolution by an ordinary resolution of the Shareholders in a general meeting prior to the next annual general meeting of the Company following the AGM.

Under the Listing Rules, the Company is required to give the Shareholders all information which is reasonably necessary to enable the Shareholders to make an informed decision as to whether to vote for or against the resolution for the grant of the Repurchase Mandate to the Directors. The explanatory statement required by the Listing Rules is set out in Appendix I to this circular.

LETTER FROM THE BOARD

The Directors wish to state that they have no immediate plan to issue any new Shares pursuant to the Issue Mandate. With reference to the Repurchase Mandate, the Directors have no immediate plan to repurchase any Shares pursuant thereof.

3. RETIREMENT AND RE-ELECTION OF DIRECTORS

Pursuant to article 83 (3) of the Articles of Association, any Director appointed by the Board to fill a causal vacancy shall hold office until the first general meeting of the Company after his appointment and be subjected to re-election at such meeting and any Director appointed by the Board as an addition to the existing Board shall hold office only until the next following annual general meeting of the Company and shall then be eligible for re-election.

Pursuant to article 84(1) of the Articles of Association, at each annual general meeting one-third of the Directors for the time being (or, if their number is not a multiple of three(3), the number nearest to but not less than one-third) shall retire from office by rotation provided that every Director shall be subject to retirement at an annual general meeting at least once every three years. A retiring Director shall be eligible for re-election.

In accordance with article 83(3) of the Articles of Association, Mr. DENG Kui (“Mr. DENG”), shall retire from office by rotation at the AGM. Being eligible, Mr. DENG will offer himself for re-election as an executive Director at the same meeting.

In accordance with article 84 (1) of the Articles of Association, Mr. LEONG Hing Loong Rudoff (“Mr. LEONG”) and Mr. LIU Gang (“Mr. LIU”) shall retire from office by rotation at the AGM. Being eligible, each of Mr. LEONG and Mr. LIU will offer themselves for re-election as executive Director and independent non-executive Director respectively at the same meeting.

The biographical details of the above mentioned Directors who are subject to re-election at the AGM are set out in Appendix II to this circular.

4. AGM AND PROXY ARRANGEMENT

A notice convening the AGM to be held at Suite 2608-11, 26th Floor, Champion Tower, Three Garden Road, Central, Hong Kong on Monday, 28 May 2018 at 10:30 a.m. is set out on pages 14 to 17 of this circular. At the AGM, in addition to the ordinary businesses of the meeting, resolutions will be proposed for approval on the proposed Issue Mandate, the Repurchase Mandate and the Extension Mandate as special businesses.

For determining eligibility to attend and vote at the AGM, the register of members of the Company will be closed from 23 May 2018 to 28 May 2018, both days inclusive, during which period no transfer of Shares will be registered. In order to be eligible to attend and vote at the AGM, all transfer of Shares, accompanied by the relevant share certificates, must be lodged with the Company’s branch share registrar and transfer office in Hong Kong, Tricor Investor Services Limited, at Level 22, Hopewell Centre, 183 Queen’s Road East, Hong Kong, for registration not later than 4:30 p.m. on 21 May 2018.

LETTER FROM THE BOARD

A form of proxy for use by the Shareholders at the AGM is enclosed with this circular. Whether or not you intend to attend and vote at the AGM in person, you are requested to complete the enclosed form of proxy in accordance with the instructions printed thereon and return the same to the Company's branch share registrar and transfer office in Hong Kong, Tricor Investor Services Limited, at Level 22, Hopewell Centre, 183 Queen's Road East, Hong Kong as soon as possible and in any event no later than Saturday, 26 May 2018 at 10:30 a.m. (Hong Kong time) or any adjournment thereof. Completion and return of the form of proxy will not preclude the Shareholders from attending and voting in person at the AGM or any adjourned meeting should you so wish.

5. VOTING BY POLL

Pursuant to Rule 13.39(4) of the Listing Rules, any vote of Shareholders at a general meeting must be taken by poll. Therefore, the chairman of the AGM will demand a poll for all the resolutions to be put forward at the AGM pursuant to article 66 of the Articles of Association. The Company will appoint scrutineers to handle vote-taking procedures at the AGM. The results of the poll will be published on the websites of the Stock Exchange and the Company as soon as possible after the AGM in accordance with Rule 13.39(5) of the Listing Rules.

6. RESPONSIBILITY STATEMENT

This circular, for which the Directors collectively and individually accept full responsibility, includes particulars given in compliance with the Listing Rules for the purpose of giving information with regard to the Company. The Directors, having made all reasonable enquiries, confirm that to the best of their knowledge and belief the information contained in this circular is accurate and complete in all material respects and not misleading or deceptive, and there are no other matters the omission of which would make any statement herein or this circular misleading.

7. RECOMMENDATION

The Board is pleased to recommend all of the retiring Directors to stand for re-election by Shareholders as Directors. The Directors also consider that the proposed resolutions set out in the notice of AGM, including the grant of the Issue Mandate, the Repurchase Mandate and the Extension Mandate are in the best interests of the Company and the Shareholders as a whole. APPENDIX I EXPLANATORY STATEMENT ON THE REPURCHASE MANDATE

This appendix serves as an explanatory statement, as required under the Listing Rules, to provide requisite information to Shareholders in connection with the Repurchase Mandate.

1. SHARE CAPITAL

As at the Latest Practicable Date, the authorised share capital of the Company was HK\$10,000,000 divided into 1,000,000,000 Shares, among which a total of 500,000,000 Shares were issued and fully paid-up.

Subject to the passing of the relevant ordinary resolution at the AGM approving the Repurchase Mandate and on the basis that no further Shares will be issued or repurchased prior to the AGM, the Company will be allowed under the Repurchase Mandate to repurchase a maximum of 50,000,000 Shares.

2. REASONS FOR REPURCHASES

The Directors believe that the proposed grant of the Repurchase Mandate is in the interests of the Company and the Shareholders as a whole. The Repurchase Mandate will give the Company the flexibility to repurchase Shares as and when appropriate. Such repurchases may, depending on market conditions and funding arrangements at the time, lead to an enhancement of the net asset value and/or earnings per Share and will only be made when the Directors believe that such repurchases will benefit the Company and the Shareholders as a whole.

3. FUNDING OF REPURCHASES

In repurchasing the Shares, the Company may only apply funds of the Company legally available for such purpose in accordance with the Listing Rules, the Articles of Association, the laws of the Cayman Islands, and other applicable laws.

A listed company may not repurchase its own securities on the Stock Exchange for a consideration other than cash or for settlement otherwise than in accordance with the trading rules of the Stock Exchange from time to time.

Under the Companies Law, any repurchases by the Company may be made out of profits of the Company, out of the Company's share premium account or out of the proceeds of a fresh issue of Shares made for the purpose of the repurchase or, if authorised by the Articles of Association and subject to the Companies Law, out of capital. Any premium payable on a redemption or purchase over the par value of the Shares to be repurchased must be provided for out of either or both of the profits or the share premium account of the Company, or, if authorised by the Articles of Association and subject to the Companies Law, out of capital.

4. STATUS OF REPURCHASED SHARES

The Listing Rules provide that the listing of all repurchased shares is automatically cancelled and that the certificates for those shares must be cancelled and destroyed. Under the laws of the Cayman Islands, a company's repurchased shares may be treated as cancelled or held as treasury shares. When cancelled, the Company's issued share capital (but not the authorised share capital) will be reduced accordingly.

5. IMPACT ON WORKING CAPITAL OR GEARING POSITION

Taking into account the current working capital position of the Company, the Directors consider that, the exercise of the Repurchase Mandate in full will have a material adverse impact on the working capital and/or gearing position of the Company as compared with the position disclosed in the Company's audited financial statements for the fifteen months ended 31 December 2017. However, the Directors do not propose to exercise the Repurchase Mandate to such an extent as would, in the circumstances, have a material adverse effect on the working capital requirements of the Company or the gearing levels which in the opinion of the Directors are from time to time appropriate for the Company.

6. DISCLOSURE OF INTERESTS

As at the Latest Practicable Date, to the best knowledge of the Directors having made all reasonable enquiries, none of the Directors nor, any of their close associates have a present intention to sell Shares to the Company if the Repurchase Mandate is approved by the Shareholders.

No core connected persons of the Company have notified the Company that they have a present intention to sell Shares to the Company, or have undertaken not to do so, in the event that the Company is authorised to make repurchases of Shares.

7. UNDERTAKING OF THE DIRECTORS

The Directors have undertaken to the Stock Exchange that, so far as the same may be applicable, they will exercise the power of the Company to make repurchases of Shares pursuant to the Repurchase Mandate in accordance with the Listing Rules, the Articles of Association, the laws of the Cayman Islands and the applicable laws.

8. EFFECT OF THE TAKEOVERS CODE

If as a result of a repurchase of Shares, a Shareholder's proportionate interest in the voting rights of the Company increases, such increase will be treated as an acquisition of voting rights for the purpose of Rule 32 of the Takeovers Code and Rule 6 of the Share Buy-backs Code. Accordingly, a Shareholder or a group of Shareholders acting in concert (within the meaning of the Takeovers Code), could obtain or consolidate control of the Company and become obliged to make a mandatory offer in accordance with Rule 26 of the Takeovers Code.

The Directors have no present intention to exercise the Repurchase Mandate to such an extent that would result in the Company failing to comply with the public float requirements under the Rule 8.08 of the Listing Rules.

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

Mr. DENG Kui

Mr. DENG Kui, aged 38, has been appointed as an executive Director, Chairman of the Board, chairman and member of the nomination committee of the Company and an authorised representative of the Company with effect from 6 July 2017. Mr. DENG is primarily responsible for formulating the Group's overall strategic planning and directions.

Mr. DENG has worked in aviation and finance related fields for a number of years and has extensive experience in banking and innovation finance, mergers and acquisitions, and aviation-related investments. Mr. DENG had served as a member of the senior management of CITIC Bank Shanghai Branch. From May 2016 to June 2017, Mr. DENG was the General Manager of Shanghai Huaxin Group (Hong Kong) Limited.

Mr. DENG is a general committee member of the Fourteenth Term of Office of the Hong Kong Chinese Enterprises Association, a member of the 11th Shanghai Youth Federation, a vice chairman of Hong Kong Hubei Fraternity and an executive council member of Hubei Chinese Overseas Friendship Association. Mr. DENG obtained a Master's degree of engineering in Software Engineering from Northwestern Polytechnical University.

Mr. DENG has entered into a service agreement with the Company regarding his appointment as Executive Director for a term of 3 years commencing from 6 July 2017, subject to retirement by rotation and re-election at annual general meeting of the Company at least once every three years in accordance with the Articles of Association of the Company. Mr. LEONG has worked for our Group for over 20 years since the commencement of business of LCL Architects Limited in 1996.

Mr. LEONG obtained a Bachelor's Degree in Architecture from the University of Western Australia in Australia in December 1989. He has been a member of The Hong Kong Institute of Architects and an Overseas Member Level 1 of the Royal Australian Institute of Architects (formerly known as the Australian Institute of Architects) since April 1992. He has been a registered architect in Hong Kong since 1992. He was also a Chartered International Member of the Royal Institute of British Architects from 1992 to 2012.
